## Golf

The Club Championship was staged over the weekend of 18<sup>th</sup>/19<sup>th</sup> June, with difficult conditions to say the least, facing the 72 competitors – where is all this wind coming from?!

The conditions on the Saturday were particularly challenging which was reflected in the scoring.

At the half way point Andy Barnes and Ritchie Farmer were tied for the lead on gross 74.

The Sunday brought slightly calmer conditions and in an exciting finish, Trevor Greenfield with a 71 to add to his 76 on Saturday achieved the lowest gross score, just ahead of Ritchie Farmer and Andy Barnes.

The Warren Cup for the best net score was won by Matt Greenfield.

The Mistlin & Chapman cups for handicap players 16 and over was also held on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> June in the similar windy conditions. 32 competitors battled against the elements, with Cahel Logan (93) winning the Mistlin Cup (gross) and Mark Allen (95-19) winning the Chapman cup (net) after a count back from David Champion. ## What To Do During A Lightning Storm (Continuation)

Seek shelter at the first sign of a thunderstorm. If the course's warning system sounds, head for cover. (Single loud blast from the klaxon)

- If possible, get off the golf course.
- Do not stand under a lone tree. This is where most people are injured or killed.
- Stay away from water.
- Stay away from your golf clubs.
- If your shoes have metal spikes, take them off.
- Move away from your golf buggy if using one.
- If stranded in the open, go to the lowest place such as a bunker. (Note: If you feel a tingling sensation and the hair on your arms stands up, squat down, balancing on the balls of your feet, feet together, arms in front of your knees. If in a group, members of the group should keep at least 15 feet apart.)
- 3 short blasts of the klaxon will signify when it is safe to continue.
